

Understanding Your Referral



What does it mean if a provider has letters or numbers after his/her name?

If a provider has an RC after her name that means she has a residential certificate instead of a license. A residential certificate requires less training than a license. An RC provider needs at least 10 hours of yearly training; a licensed provider (no RC after name) needs at least 20 hours of yearly training. The adult/ child ratios for both RC and licensed programs are 1 adult to 8 children.



What is the difference between Family, Family Group, and Center?

Family Child Care means a provider does child care in her home. The adult/ child ratios are 1 adult to 8 children with no more than 2 children under the age of 2, or 1 adult to 6 children with no more than 3 children under the age of 2.

Family Group Child Care means a provider does child care in her home. The adult/ ratios are 2 adults to 9-16 children with no more than 4 children under the age of 2.

Child Care Center means a facility is licensed to do child care. The adult/ratios are: 1 adult to 4 children (0-24 months), 1 adult to 7 children (2 year old), 1 adult to 12 children (3 year old), 1 adult to 15 children (4 year old), 1 adult to 20 children (5 years and older).
