

Understanding Your Referral

What is the difference between Family, Family Group, and Center?

Family Childcare means a provider does childcare in her home. The adult/child ratios are 1 adult to 8 children with no more than 2 children under the age of 2, or 1 adult to 6 children with no more than 3 children under the age of 2.

Family Group Childcare means a provider does childcare in her home. The adult/ratios are 2 adults to 9-16 children with no more than 4 children under the age of 2.

Childcare Center means a facility is licensed to do childcare. The adult/ratios are: 1 adult to 4 children (0-24 months), 1 adult to 7 children (2 year old), 1 adult to 12 children (3 year old), 1 adult to 15 children (4 year old), 1 adult to 20 children (5 years and older).
