Date	Class	CDA Category	CAC Level	Course Description
November 3, 5, 10, 12	Guidance & Emotional Wellness #2 Instructor: Brittney Nelson	Emotional Wellness	5-8	In this course participants will learn about the importance of developmental theory to guidance and emotional wellness. They will learn about additional concepts developed by CSEFEL (Center for Social Emotional Foundations for Early Learning). They will learn that building healthy relationships and creating supportive environments are the cornerstones of helping children succeed socially and emotionally.
November 3, 5, 10, 12	All About Twos Instructor: Kris Evans	Child Dev.	1-8	This course focuses on the unique needs of two year olds and how to be a successful two-year-old caregiver. Participants will learn how to promote language-cognitive-social and emotional development, and how to create an environment that supports two year-old needs and caregiver sanity.
November 17, 19, & December 1, 3	Infant Toddler Course #2 Instructor: Brionne Neilson	Infant Toddler	5-8	In this course participants learn about the emotional and social development of infants and toddlers. Areas of focus include: temperaments, responsive caregiving, and the caregiver's role in fostering emotional development, socialization, and guidance.
December 2	Behavior Is Communication Instructor: Chris Weber	Social & Emotional		Behavior is Communication class will be focusing on WHY my student has problem behaviors. We will be discussing universal strategies to address their inappropriate behaviors that can be used in every classroom. Our class will have a focus on how teachers can be more proactive instead of reactive in their classrooms, decreasing inappropriate behaviors from their students.
December 7, 9	Making Learning Fun Instructor: Chelsea Oaks	Child Dev.	1-3, 5-8	In this course participants will learn about best practices for early childhood programs. Topics include: effective teachers, play versus academics, project approach to curriculum development, art, cooking, the importance of outdoor play, dramatic play, and music.
December 7, 9, 14, 16	Theory & Best Practices #2 Instructor: Brionne Neilson	Theories & Best Practices	5-8	In this course participants will learn about Erickson's life work and gain an understanding of his Psychosocial Development Theory. Participants will also learn about levels of Bronfenbrenner's Ecological Systems Theory and how to apply them to the child care profession.
December 8, 10, 15, 17	Unlocking The Creative Mind Instructor: Kris Evans	Specialty Course	5-8	In this course participants will learn the value of creative art, dramatic play, creative movement, music and dance, and the important roles they play in a young child's life.
