

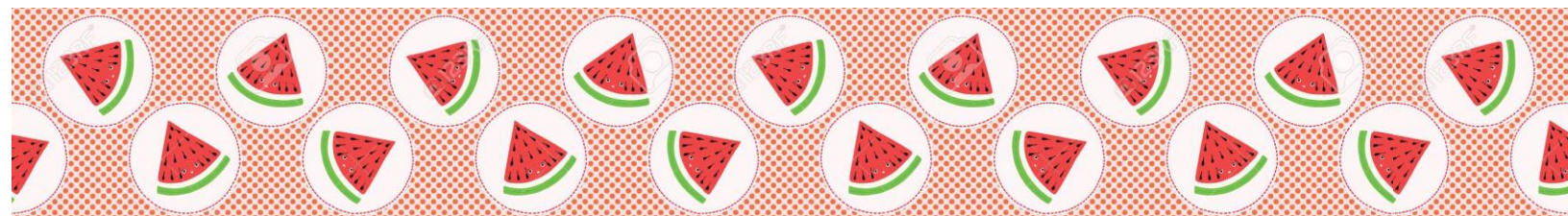

September 7, 9, 14, 16, 21 Instructor: Carol Watson	Back To Basics In Person (St. George location)	Basic Child Development	Levels 1-3	In this course participants will learn about 5 different teaching tools. In the blocks class, participants will learn how adding blocks to different activity areas can help promote cognitive, social and large motor skills in play. Participants will also learn key art skills to use in teaching children how to enjoy art in the classroom. Participants will learn methods of using playdough and skills that children will learn by implementing playdough into a best practice classroom. Participants will also learn the value of music in the classroom. In the science class, participants will learn how to implement the Scientific Method to use during science and what “big” questions to ask while participating in a science activity.
September 11, 18 Instructor:	Working Together Virtual	Working With Families	Levels 2-3	In this course participants learn effective strategies for establishing and maintaining open and positive relationships with each child's family, encouraging family involvement in the childcare program, and supporting each child's relationship with his or her family.

Virtual	Safe, Healthy Environment	Levels 2-3	In this course participants learn how to set up center and home-based child care programs to encourage play, exploration, and learning. Information is included on spaces and materials for block play, dramatic play, puzzles, games, books and literacy activities, art, sensory play, and outdoor play.
September 13, 15, 20, 22 Instructor: Kris Evans	School Age #1 Virtual	School Age	Levels 5-8	In this course participants will gain a basic knowledge of child development during the school age years and how they can apply this knowledge in their work with school age children.
September 21, 23, 28, 30 Marci Childs	Looking To Learn Virtual	Observing & Recording	Levels 2-3	In this course participants learn effective tools and strategies for gathering and using observational information about children. Areas of focus include: learning to observe children accurately and objectively, observation tools and goals, overcoming obstacles to observation, and interpreting and using observation data

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
